February 26 in SLC</p> <p>Eligible Training Provider List (ETPL)</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • WIOA made changes to the Eligible Training Provider List process. • New requirements <ul style="list-style-type: none"> ○ Provide a list quarterly for the Board to ratify new providers and program study eligibility. ○ All schools, regardless of Title IV status, must apply for each program they want approved. ○ Utah must track WIOA funded customer performance data. To assist with consumer choice, data will be provided in aggregate on the ETPL. ○ Utah can set levels of performance regarding completion rate, wage after completion, etc. Federal load default rate, state licensing and accreditation are also now required to be reviewed. ○ Registered Apprenticeships are encouraged to be on the ETPL. • Programs that were approved under WIA must go through a review process by the end of April. WIOA allows those providers to file a waiver with the Board to have up to two years to provide all required information for the review. • If a training provider application is denied or the program is removed from the ETPL due to not being standards, falsifying information etc. the program specialists takes action to remove them. If the provider does not agree, they can file an appeal with the Board. The Board would determine if the provider is removed or if they can stay on the ETPL.
